








- Extension of AML Fee Collection through FY 2034
- Reduction of AML Fee Rate <u>by 20%</u>.
 New rates will be:
 - Surface Mining 22.4 cents/ton
 - Underground 9.6 cents/ton
 - Lignite 6.4 cents/ton
- Extension of AML Mandatory Distribution <u>through FY 2035</u>
